The caterpillar eats through one piece of cake on Saturday


The caterpillar eats through one pickle on Saturday

The caterpillar eats through one sausage on Saturday


The caterpillar eats through one slice of watermelon on Saturday

The caterpillar eats through one green leaf on Sunday







Print on yellow – what doing
