
Concepts in Pictures 6

Now...means 'at this moment'.. or what is happening as we are speaking.




Look around you as I am saying these words.

What is the person sitting next to you, doing. NOW?





Tell the child (or children) that you are going to turn over a picture, and that they must carry out the action on the picture... But... that you will tell them to do the action NOW... or SOON.

Example: Turn over a picture and say, "Touch your nose... NOW"


Turn over the next picture and say, "Wiggle your fingers...SOON" (Hold up your hand, wait 5-10 seconds then say "Wiggle your fingers...NOW")

When the children are familiar with the game, they can take turns in leading the actions and deciding whether they should be done NOW... or SOON



EARLY ... and ... LATE


Early... can mean two things Early can mean... the very first part of a certain time of the day. Let me explain!

(araw open eyes)






Early in the afternoon, I


Early in the evening,


EARLY... can also mean arriving before the time you have arranged to see someone or do something. Look what happens to Early Shirley!
